


CM/ECF version 2 Internet Payment Information
Thursday, June 12, 2003

A new feature of Version 2 of CM/ECF is the capability for attorneys to make credit card payments via the Internet.


All attorneys who are certified users of CM/ECF in the Eastern District of Kentucky can, and should, pay their filing fees via the Internet. You should use an Internet browser that is set to 128-bit encryption for any document that requires a fee, such as a new petition, motion for relief, etc. *(While you will still be able to use Case Upload when paying via the Internet, you will NOT be able to use Case Upload if you are paying the filing fee in installments. Currently, all Internet credit card transactions with Case Upload are charged the full filing fee.)*

When filing an event that entails a fee, you will see one screen that has changed slightly:




As the warning message indicates, you should not enter anything in the receipt box if you will be paying with your credit card.

After the docketing of the event has been completed and submitted, you will see the following screen:




If you choose to continue filing, CM/ECF records the charge and displays it each time you docket an event. This feature is helpful when you are filing documents for several cases. When entering the last pleading, you can make one payment for all outstanding filing fees.

When you choose to “pay now,” you will be prompted for your credit card information – type, card # and expiration date. After submitting this information, the final screen you see will verify that your transaction has been completed and give you a transaction number:



CM/ECF also makes available two reports to help you keep track of your Internet payments. These can be found on the Utilities menu, in the “Your Account” section.

The first is the Internet Payment History. This listing includes all payment of charges incurred via the Internet. The payments are in order by receipt number and can be requested for a specified date range.
